It was mentioned that 124 Seymour Road is still on the market.

Chairman Tim Austin announce that the State has Approved the Greenway Map. The piece of land discussed several months ago, at 7 Forest Glen; the State of CT has not responded to the lot that is for sale.

The members present decided to wait until January,2024, to possibly create a pilot project for the Pollinator Pathway. They will discuss at that time what the role of the Woodbridge Conservation Commission would be for this project.

At 8:22pm, a Work Session began regarding properties worthy of acquisitions/preservation.
