# 10 Criteria to determine comparison towns

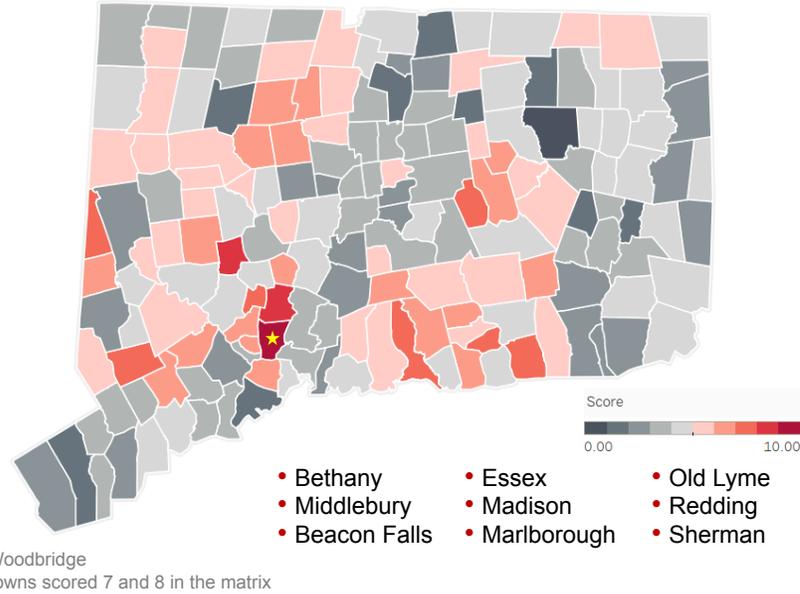
- ENGL change over last five years
- 2016 DRG
- % population age 19 and under
- % ENGL residential
- % population over age 65
- % ENGL C/I/PU
- Land area in square miles
- If in regional school district
- Population 2016
- Town Input

- Identify policies to strengthen grand list, demonstrate resilience to state budget cuts, and handle future demographic changes
