

## Police Department Reminds Community to Lock Vehicles

In the past three months, the Woodbridge Police Dept. reports an increase of stolen vehicles in Woodbridge. In addition, vehicles have been rummaged through, resulting in items being stolen from within these vehicles.

Almost all incidents involved vehicles that were left unlocked and were not physically "broken into." These activities have been spread throughout the entire Town, are not isolated to a specific area, and have mostly taken place during the overnight and early morning hours.

Woodbridge Police Chief Frank Cappiello, after meeting with the South Central Chiefs of Police, notes that our neighboring communities are reporting similar experiences. In response, Woodbridge Police patrol deployments have been both redirected and increased. Chief Cappiello states "Local law enforcement agencies are



constantly sharing information and we continue to collaborate in our attempt to combat the problem." Steps Woodbridge residents can take to help:

- Lock your cars and garages at all times
- Do not leave spare keys in your vehicle, or valuables in plain view
- Immediately report suspicious activity to the Police by calling 203-387-2511 (non-emergency number)

In addition, Chief Cappiello asks that community members who would like to be involved at the neighborhood level become "the added eyes and ears of the community" by getting to know your neighbors, and reporting any suspicious persons, vehicles, or activity. Please contact the Police

## Fire Department - Home Improvement Tips

Oil-based paints, stains, and varnishes are often used for home improvement projects. It is common to use rags to wipe up spills or clean brushes. Wet rags can ignite on their own. They can start a fire if not handled carefully.



**How can rags start a fire?** Oils commonly used in oil-based paints and stains release heat as they dry. If the heat is not released in the air, it builds up and is trapped which results in fire. Be aware this does not happen with water-based finishes.

Safety tips to follow:

- Never leave cleaning rags in a pile.
- Take the rags outside to either hang dry or spread them on the ground, never in a pile, to dry. Weigh them down so they do not blow away and be sure they are kept away from buildings.
- Put dried rags in a metal container ensuring the cover is tight. Fill the container with a water and detergent solution to break down the oils.
- Keep containers of oily rags in a cool place. Never place the container in direct sunlight or near other heat sources.




