Our Future and the Country Club

Wishing everyone a very happy and healthy New Year!

As we begin the new year, I am reminded that our small town is at an important crossroads. The vote to sell approximately 1/3 of the former Country Club of Woodbridge (CCW) for senior housing will eliminate our debt from the purchase of the land and bring in much needed ongoing tax revenue.

Selling a portion of the former Country Club of Woodbridge for development would provide us with up to 120 homes for residents 55+. Instead of leaving Woodbridge for other towns with 55+ housing, residents will be able to remain in Woodbridge.

We need more tax revenue to lower the tax burden of our residents and selling a portion of the former Country Club of Woodbridge for development would provide us with an estimated additional \$1.5M in yearly tax revenue once all the units are sold. Equally as important to increasing revenue is our continuous efforts to reduce expenses. We have consolidated many parts of our government and staff and will continue this important review. It should be noted that ~30% of our budget goes to the Amity Regional School district and the Town has no control over these expenses. Another ~30% percent of the budget goes to our exemplary Beecher Road School, which is one of our greatest assets.



We also need to ensure that Woodbridge is an attractive place for current and future residents and businesses. Lowering our tax burden is one way to be attractive, and offering meaningful programs and activities is another way. The Town will continue to own approximately 2/3 of the former Country Club property — about 95 acres — and we could create a beautiful park on the property. My vision is for a playground, sledding hill, gazebo/pavilion, walking trails and fishing pond. If we do not sell the property (for \$5.4M), it will be difficult to convert the remaining land to a park or even properly maintain it.

We have limited options to raise revenue in our Town and approval of Senior Housing will significantly increase our Grand List which results in added tax revenue. I strongly believe taxpayers should have a say in whether Senior Housing is permitted at the former CCW at a Referendum on this very important issue as we cannot and will not move forward unless a majority of our voters approve.

The draft agreement between the Town and Insite/Wernert will be available for public review at Town Hall prior to the vote.

Board of Assessment Appeals Notice

The Board of Assessment Appeals of the Town of Woodbridge will be holding their annual appeal meetings on:

- Thu., March 12, 6-9 pm
- Fri., March 13, 6-9 pm
- Sat., March 21, 9 am - 12 pm.

Meetings will be held at Town Hall to hear appeals relating to assessments for Real Property & Business Personal Property on the October 1, 2019 Grand List.

Written applications are mandatory, no appeal will be heard without one. Applications may be obtained from the Assessor's Office, Monday - Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. All original applications must be filled out and returned to the Assessor's office **no later than 4:30 pm, February 20, 2020**. All persons filing proper

applications shall be notified by March 1 of the day, time and place of their appeal hearing.

It is necessary to appear in person or send a duly authorized representative who must bring written evidence of authorization and their own personal identification. If appealing the assessed value of your property, you must present documents as evidence in support of your claim or an appraiser's analysis of your property value based on 2019 (the revaluation year) comparable sales. **Comparable sales are those of similar style, size and location and must be from the year 2019.**

Tax Relief Programs

Woodbridge residents may file applications for the State and Town Elderly and Totally Disabled Tax Relief Programs by May 15, 2020 with the Town Assessor.

Residents eligible for State and Town tax relief programs include individuals who:

1. turned age 65 on or before Dec. 31, 2019; individuals on Social Security Disability are exempt from this age requirement.
2. hold full time residence in Woodbridge.
3. meet the State program income limits of \$37,000 maximum for singles and \$45,100 maximum for married couples.
4. meet the Town program income limits (for single or married) of \$45,100 maximum to qualify for a \$1,400 Tier 1 credit and \$76,670 maximum for a \$1,120 Tier 2 credit.

Proof of 2019 income and Social Security earnings is required.

Tax relief is also available for veterans through a local veteran exemption offered through the Town. There is no age requirement and applications must be filed by May 15, 2020.

To qualify, honorable discharge papers (DD-214) must have been filed with the Town Clerk's office by Sept. 30, 2019. The maximum income for this program is \$62,000 for a single person or \$70,100 for a married couple.

Applications for all programs will be mailed to residents who are presently on a program and need to refile.

Courtesy Renewals to Start February 1

The Woodbridge Town Library will begin to offer courtesy renewals to our patrons on February 1, 2020. The change was recommended by the LION Consortium which is committed to sharing, expanding and promoting excellent library resources and services. Courtesy renewals mean that a few days before checked-out items are due, all that are eligible will be automatically renewed.

Materials will not be eligible for courtesy renewals if:

- another patron has a hold on the item.
- the item has reached its maximum number of allowable renewals.



- renewals are not allowed for the item (e.g. museum passes or items in a bestseller collection).
- The relevant patron's account is expired or suspended.

This service does not apply to downloadable or streaming materials. Only items owned by the Woodbridge Town Library, or those of another LION library that have enacted courtesy renewals, will automatically be renewed.

Library staff will be happy to answer any renewal questions—stop by at any time.




