HazWaste Collection & Household Shredding

On Saturday, July 19, from 9 am to noon, the Department of Public Works will host HazWaste Satellite Collection along with Household Shredding at the Woodbridge Transfer and Recycling Station, 85 Acorn Hill Ext.

For shredding, residents may simply bring their household paperwork to the Transfer Station.

To use the HazWaste Satellite Collection, residents must submit an electronic [HazWaste Preregistration Form](#) prior to bringing any hazardous materials to the Transfer Station. To locate this form on the Town website, go to the Transfer and Recycling Station page and choose Household Hazardous Waste Program.

Through October, Woodbridge residents may also dispose of hazardous materials every Saturday from 9 am - noon at the Regional Water Authority (RWA) located at 90 Sargent Drive, New Haven.

This service is available to residents because the Town is a member of the RWA HazWaste Central Program. Motor Vehicle Appeal Notice

In September, the Woodbridge Board of Assessment Appeals (BAA) will meet at Town Hall located at 11 Meetinghouse Lane to hear appeals relating to motor vehicles assessments on the Grand List of October 1, 2024.

To present your appeal to the Board, it is requested that a completed Appeal Application be returned to the Assessor's Office by Friday, August 22 so a September appointment with the BAA may be scheduled.

Motor vehicle assessments are based on original MSRP (Manu-

facturer's Suggested Retail Price) and schedule of depreciation as of October 1, 2024, per new legislation. To substantiate an appeal, documents relating to MSRP may be submitted with the application to the Assessor's Office at Town Hall or mailed to the Assessor at 11 Meetinghouse Lane.

Beginning August 1, applications will be available in the Assessor's Office or found online at woodbridgect.org on the Assessor's page under [Board of Assessment Appeals](#). Call the office with questions, 203-389-3416.

Taxes are Due July 1

August 1, 2025. For a receipt, enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope along with the entire bill.

Online Credit card payments may be made via the payment link at the bottom of the [Tax Collector page](#) on the Town website only—there is a fee for this service.
