

## **Your Vote Counts!**

### **Municipal Election – Tuesday November 4, 2025, Center Gym**

### **Early Voting - Mon Oct. 20 – Sun Nov. 2 – Library Meeting Room**

The right to vote is one of our most fundamental liberties and one of our most important duties as citizens. If you will be 18 years old by November 4 and are a US citizen, then you are eligible to register and vote in the town you live in.

#### **How do I register to Vote?**

In Connecticut you have several ways to register to vote:

- You may register online at <https://voterregistration.ct.gov/>.
- You may download a registration form at <https://portal.ct.gov/sots/election-services/register-to-vote/voter-registration-application-english-and-spanish> fill it out and mail it to your local Town Clerk or Registrar of Voters.
- When you apply for a Connecticut Driver's License, Learners Permit, or State ID you will be given an opportunity to register to vote.
- You may appear in person on any Early Voting Day (Oct. 20 – Nov. 2) or on Election Day and register to vote at the Polling Location (Early Voting – Library Meeting Room) or the Designated Same Day Registration (SDR) location for Election Day (Woodbridge Center Cafeteria).
- You may appear in person at either the Town Clerks Office or the Registrars office during normal office hours and they can assist you in registering.
- Also, any Public Library or State Social Service agency can assist you in registering.

To register for the first time at SDR you will need to establish **both** your identity and your residence. A Connecticut Driver's License, Learners Permit or State ID with your current address will serve to establish both. You can also use the last four digits of your Social Security Number along with proof of residency (such as a recent utility or mortgage bill). If you do not have either of these available, the registrars can assist you with alternate forms of identification.

The registrar's office will be open from 9am – 8pm on Friday October 17 for a mandatory registration session, any voter may stop by if they have any registration questions. In addition, the registrar's

office will be open Monday November 3 from 9am – 5pm to register anyone who became eligible since October 17 either because they had their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday or they moved into town during that period.

## **How do I Vote**

Connecticut offers several ways for you to vote.

- You may come to the polls in person on election day. The polls are open from 6am – 8pm in the **Center Gym, 4 Meetinghouse Lane (across from the library)**.
- If you are going to be out of town, are ill or unable to come to the polls, you can vote by absentee ballot. To vote by absentee ballot you need to:
  - Fill out an application online at [myvote.ct.gov/getmyab](http://myvote.ct.gov/getmyab) or obtain an application directly from the Town Clerk or the Secretary of State.
  - After receiving your application, the Town Clerk will mail you an absentee ballot or give you one in person if you come to the Town Clerk's office. After completing the ballot, you may return it by:
    - Giving it directly to the Town Clerk.
    - Mailing the ballot back to the Town Clerk.
    - Depositing the ballot in the lock box outside of your Town Hall.
    - Having an immediate family member return it for you.
- You may also opt to vote in person during the Early Voting period which runs from Monday October 20 – Sunday November 2 and includes weekends. Hours are from 10am – 6pm except for Tuesday October 28 and Thursday October 30 when hours are from 8am – 8pm. This year the Early Voting Location will be in the **Library Meeting Room on 10 Newton Road directly across from the Center Gym**.

## **Volunteering to work at the Polls**

If you are 18 or older and a registered voter, you can volunteer to work in any municipality in Connecticut. If you are between the ages of 16 and 18 you can volunteer in the town where you live with a Parent/Guardian written permission. To volunteer please contact your Registrar of Voters.
