Veteran Tax Exemption Applications Due

The Woodbridge Assessor reminds eligible veterans to file the Permanently & Totally Disabled Veteran with 100% Service-Connected Disability Rating Tax Exemption Application with the Assessor's Office **no later than January 1, 2026**. The qualifying Veteran Administration documentation must be submitted with the application.

Applications must be filed each year. Applications were mailed to veterans who have previously filed for this tax exemption. For exemption details and to print the application, go to [Veterans Exemptions](#) from the Assessor page on the Town website. Applications are also available in the Assessor's Office at Town Hall.

Reminder from the Tax Office

Real Estate, Personal Property and new Supplemental Motor Vehicle Taxes are due Jan. 1, 2026. Postcard reminders with important information will be mailed in early December.

Payments received **after** Feb. 2, will be charged interest on unpaid balance at the rate of 1.5 % per month. The minimum interest charge is \$2.

As a reminder, payments that are not received by March may be referred to a State Marshal for collection. Specific details may be viewed on the [Tax Collector page](#) on the Town website, woodbridge.org.

For in person payments, the Tax Office will be open weekdays, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm (closed Jan. 1 & 19). On Mon., Feb. 2, the office will be open 8:30 am to 7 pm.

Credit card payments will be accepted via the Town website only. There is a fee for the service. Go to the [Tax Collector page](#) to make a credit card payment, to review the Legal Notice, and to review important Tax information. Call Tax Collector Pat Crisco with questions at 203-389-3425.

Failure to receive a bill does not exempt taxpayers from payment or penalty, per CT General Statute 12-130, 12-146.
